

#### **Coin train**





In a time when connections between inland and the Costa del Sol are more important than ever, few people know that almost 100 years ago, a train ran between Coín and Málaga. In 1913, after eight years of work, was inagurated the railway Málaga-Coin. Most of the four million pesetas which it cost was invested by a Belgian company. Before then, the residents who needed to reach Málaga city had either to walk or travel by donkey, horse or carriage.
